ESCAPE INTO CALGARY'S URBAN PARKS AND MEET YOUR WILD NEIGHBOURS!

CALGARY CAPTURED IS A MULTI-YEAR WILDLIFE MONITORING AND CITIZEN SCIENCE BASED PROGRAM THAT UTILIZES TRAIL CAMERAS LOCATED THROUGHOUT OUR URBAN PARKS.

Over 60 motion-activated trail cameras located in urban parks capture thousands of images each month – including photos of deer, coyote, bobcat, cougar, moose and black bear.

We look to volunteer citizen scientists to identify the animals found in the trail camera photos from their own computer or mobile device, helping to gather important data that will further our understanding of Calgary's urban biodiversity.

The resulting data will help us to better understand species occurrence, movement and human-wildlife coexistence, enabling informed conservation and management decisions that support healthy wildlife populations.
